Course Work

We will examine radical ideas, individuals and movements in United States history as they have been reflected in the shifting American mainstream, from the beginnings of colonization to the present, centering our attention on the twentieth century.

History is the understanding of the relationship of the past to the present, without which one can neither understand the present nor make any informed predictions about the future. Our course will seek to encourage students, through readings, class lectures/discussions, films and video clips both to develop their analytical and critical skills and expand their knowledge of the content of U.S. history. We will have a takehome final and a takehome midterm which will be posted in the Canvas assignment tab. The midterm will count 35% and the final 50% for the course grade. Attendance and participation will count 15% for the course grade
