Doris L. Bergen is Chancellor Rose and Ray Wolfe Professor of Holocaust tudies. Her books include Twisted Cross: The German Christian Movenent in the Third Reich (1996); War and Genocide: A Concise History of he Holocaust (2003); The Sword of the Lord: Military Chaplains from the first to the Twenty-First Centuries (edited, 2004); and Lessons and Legaries VIII (edited, 2008). Prof. Bergen has held many grants and fellowhips, and has been guest professor at the Universities of Warsaw, Pristina, and Tuzla. Her current projects include a book on Germany military chaplains n the Nazi era; and a study of definitions of Germanness as revealed in the thnic Germans of Eastern Europe during World War II. Bergen is a member of he Academic Advisory Committee of the U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum.
